A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

I want to thank Fr Ray for his generosity in his availability to us over the last five weeks! It is such an unusual request to ask someone to assume the sacramental and spiritual needs of your parish so you can go off on a retreat for over a month, but Fr Ray was quick to say yes and I am so grateful we have such a servant in our midst. I also want to thank our parish staff and the Deacons. I truthfully, quite quickly, once the retreat started, relinquished all worry and anxiety over the temporal affairs of our parish because I knew the competent hands and minds that were in charge here! There was nothing I was worried about over those 30 days in silence - nothing! It was a great gift of God to have called me to do the retreat in the midst of an assignment where so many talented people are serving beside me. To my team here, I thank you so much! I want to also thank all of you for your patience with me being gone for so many weeks. Your day-to-day life didn't change, but knowing I had your prayers and encouragement to get away for the retreat was a gift to me!

The 30-Day that I participated in is put on by the Institute for Priestly Formation (IPF). IPF offered the course in Spiritual Direction I recently completed in Chicago. IPF was started by a lay woman and a priest from Scranton back in 1994. They, along with a few Jesuits, teamed up and answered a need to better form Seminarians in the spiritual life and what it means to be in relationship with The Holy Trinity. They saw a poverty of this deepening awareness in seminary formation and sought to heal that poverty through, what has now become, their flagship IPF Seminarian Summer Program out at Creighton: a 10 Week program of deep prayer and conversation on these matters. 8 of us (4 priests and 4 seminarians) did our 30-Day amid the Seminarians doing their summer program. You may or may not have heard of IPF (outside of my mentions throughout my Chicago classes) but let me show you why everyone in the US will reap their fruit over the coming decades.

The IPF Summer Program began in 1994 with only 6 seminarians; this year there were 120. Over the last 30 years, 3,510 Seminarians have gone through that program. If we assume just 1/3 of those guys are ordained (noting some leave and that recent years, those guys are still in school) and if we say there are 25,000 Diocesan Priests in the US, that is about 4% of US Diocesan Priests today have gone through IPF where they got a 10-Week immersion in relationship with The Trinity and are understanding their priesthood as an intense intimate encounter with the Trinity - and helping their people do the same! 4% is nice, but here is the game changing fact. This year, the US Bishops are also addressing that same poverty in formation and are implementing a new component of Seminary Formation: The Propaedeutic Stage. This is a big word that means that every new Seminarian will spend an entire year, not in school, but in an intense immersion in the spiritual life and the man's relationship with the Holy Trinity! SO, within a decade, every priest ordained will have gone through the Propaedeutic and every new priest will have spent a year - not pouring over Plato or Aquinas but, with his brothers, falling in love with The Lord so they can live and identify their future ministry from that holy place! All the while this is happening, in the background, IPF will be still immersing Seminarians over the summer and with even more priests getting away for Spiritual Direction Training and 30-Day retreats...this is the stuff of Revolution! Easily, we can see that we are only 2-3 generations away from every US Diocesan Priest and every US Bishop having been touched by either IPF or the Propaedeutic! We are just only 20 years away from the US Church looking and smelling noticeably a whole lot different - seeing Herself as a place of intense encounter with the Divine, not just a 501(c)(3)! Tune out the meaningless noise in the Church, and just pray for and support the revolution that is happening to the US Church and Her Priests!
