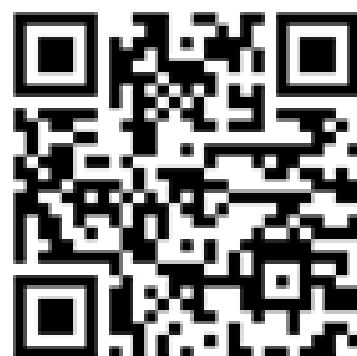

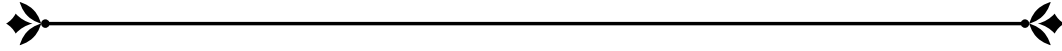

A WORD FROM FATHER TOM



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Fire is frightening; it can burn up a city. Controlled it is warming: in control in a fireplace, and it also warms the heart, when we sit back, watch the flames and chat, think or pray. Jesus came to bring fire on the earth. His is the warmth of love and companionship: when we know we can go to him just as we are, and enjoy the intimacy of his friendship - the friend who is always offering the gift of his heart to each of us.
