
All current ministers will need to attend retraining since the recommissioning is due to be renewed this Fall. Please remember that you must be recommissioned to serve in the ministry.

A WORD FROM FATHER TOM



My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"For behold, the last will be first, and the first will be last"?

It's a powerful reminder that God has a plan for each and every one of us.

Scripture often speaks of comfort and hope, and this one is no exception. It says, "For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened." In God's kingdom, there's plenty of everything we need. We're never hungry or thirsty, and our hearts find peace.

But sometimes, the door stays closed. The one who knocks is rebuffed, and we can't help but wonder what went wrong. The truth is, salvation doesn't just happen with a buzzer. It requires some strength and effort from our part. We can't just sit back and wait for God to do all the work.

We need to be open to the possibility of receiving God's love and grace. We need to be willing to let go of our fears and doubts, and to trust in God's plan for our lives. We need to be the ones who knock on the door of God's kingdom, and to be ready to answer when God opens it.
