#### A WORD FROM FATHER RAY

When we hear the opening passage from the prophet Jeremiah we possibly may find ourselves trembling in our boots. "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture." It sounds as if God is putting a humongous condemnation. But let us now as it were dig a little more so into what God is saying.

In one sense God is speaking to the clergy abuse scandal. It is something that should not have happened, but it did and we cannot sweep it under the rug. We cannot rewrite history and say that it never happened. We have to own it, learn from it, and never repeat. If you learn from church history, our church has a flawed history with several similar problems, but what shines through is that it tries to own the problem and correct it. It is sad that it had to happen, but I am glad that it had to happen; so that we can move forward from the problem.

We have to admit that those who were abused got scarred for life, their families likewise, and also the church. People lost faith in church and many turned their backs on the church and may have left. God has the solution to the problem: "I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble; and none shall be missing, says the Lord."

While I was in Bradford the diocese permitted an interview with me and one of the victims of clergy abuse. The person grew up in Bradford. I thank God for the privilege of that interview. We were both vey honest and much good came out of it. Later on, he asked if he could have an assembly to discuss that very issue. I agreed to the idea and was one of the presenters.

But now I want to expand the notion of shepherd, to include bosses and parents. Let us look at bosses first. I want to ask you how do you treat your employees. In the old days many stores were run like a family and the employees were treated as part of the family. But now many times what seems to matter most is the profit margin and employees are regarded as someone less than human. As the Golden Rule reminds us treat others as you would want to be treated. Do you give them a living wage, do they have the proper benefits?

Let us look at parents, how do you treat your children? Are they still the first in your life after yours? The Holy Family has much to teach you about what it means to be a parent. The first thing that they passed on was true love. In the Holy Family they passed on the culture and the social values of the time, they taught Jesus right from wrong, the Jewish faith and its importance. They helped Jesus become the man that he became – the Messiah. As a parent you cannot assume the role of another child to them, you are the parent. You cannot let your children tell you what to do in regards to them.

The parish is in the midst of developing a new Faith Formation Program with a new set of leaders that in some way involves all of the parish and in particular the parents. I am looking forward to its roll out and the challenges that may result from it. Parents must live by example, by that I mean you must live out your faith. You can no longer sit in your car and just drop off your child to religious ed or Mass. You must be present to give the proper example. Mary and Joseph always gave the proper example to Jesus.

Let me close with the words of Psalm 23: "The lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. In verdant pastures he gives me repose; beside restful waters he leads me; he refreshes my soul." We truly have a loving God who nurtures us much like a mother who nurtures her child.
