



CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

Who is a Mandated Reporter?

A mandated reporter is required by Pennsylvania law and the diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children to report suspected or disclosed cases of child abuse to ChildLine or law enforcement. Mandated reporters in our diocese are people who hold positions of trust in our schools, parishes, agencies, and institutions. All clergy, employees and volunteers working/serving in our parishes, schools or agencies are mandated both legally and morally to report any reasonably suspected or known child abuse to ChildLine, the local law enforcement, or other appropriate agency. A WORD FROM FATHER TOM

My Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are still basking in the joy of Easter as St. Luke reminds us of King David's promise and Jesus' promise, that Jesus would be raised and "glorified at the right hand of God." The psalm reminds us that "you will show me the path of life."

With Easter Sunday behind us now we need to remember that the hope that Easter brings lasts all year long. Just imagine the confusion the Apostle's felt in the upper room with Jesus instituting the Eucharist on Holy Thursday. We might be able to compare it with the confusing times that we find ourselves living in today. As the apostles could not believe what was getting ready to happen, we might not be able to believe the changes that have and will continue to happen to our society, government, economy at any given time.



What about the disbelief that would come with what happened the next day on Good Friday? Jesus had just said to them and had been saying to the disciples for a while, that he was to be crucified and there it was actually happening right in front of them.
