A WORD FROM FATHER BRANDON

I will have taken a few days off this past week, meeting up with a friend of mine who is on spring break from the university where he teaches, so I am writing this early in the week, and still not yet in Lent. But, fast forward, and when we're reading this, we are in Lent! This weekend we pray through the Gospel passage of the 'Temptation in the Desert'. Each of the three Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) give us unique perspectives of this scene - the scene that really is the genesis and template for our Lenten Season. One thing that strikes me among these differences is not just highlighted here in this week's Gospel, but among the totality of the Saint Luke's Gospel, and that is the role of The Holy Spirit. I mean, you could write volumes on this topic, but simply stated, Saint Luke's Gospel (as well as Acts of the Apostles, part two of his Gospel account) is in a lot of ways the story of the Holy Spirit's role in Salvation History. You could also think of "Luke-Acts" as the Gospel, or Book, of the Holy Spirit. Remember, Saint Luke gives us a privileged look into the life of Christ through eyewitnesses – probably among them, The Blessed Mother- and offers us the image of Jesus as Divine Physician; Jesus Most Merciful; Jesus, Friend of the Poor. These holy and merciful and filial attributes of Christ are guided by and offered to us through the power of The Holy Spirit. The Lord, in Luke's context, is not merely being affected by The Spirit – an external force for good - nor is He doing things simply in tandem with The Spirit, rather Our Lord is filled with the Holy Spirit and from what fills His Heart, The Lord acts and speaks! Who is the Holy Spirit and where do we find Him? Well, He is the public ministry of Jesus Christ; He is the work of the Church! I know that can sound vague and airy, but there is a lot to unpack there.

Unique to the Gospel of St Luke, the Holy Spirit 'fills' people: John the Baptist, and then he leapt in his mother's womb; Elizabeth, when she meets Mary; Zechariah, then prophesied the birth of his son and the his future heralding of the Messiah; Simeon, so that he would not die before he saw the Lord; and Jesus, upon His Baptism and being lead into the desert for forty days – His Lent! This being filled with Holy Spirit will, of course, culminate at Pentecost many weeks from now, but along the way, Saint Luke offers us glimpses of what Pentecost will be all about, and, by result, what the Church is all about! Without being too overt or unnatural about it, I would like to let the idea of the Holy Spirit, not just directing us, but filling us, be an overarching theme for our weekends of Lent this year. I have had a deeper desire to see the Holy Spirit more in the Scriptures and know Him more in my prayer, so I hope to prayerfully see Him and know Him though our Lenten Liturgies this year. Again, not forced or canned, but wherever my prayerful preparation leads each week, we will go there together. For me, having a running theme or focus for Seasons is often a aide for me in both my leadership of and participation in these holy days and weeks. So, I hope you don't mind.

Please remember that we begin Monday – Saturday confessions for Lent this week. The times are in the bulletin. Again, I want to stress that you take advantage of the entire Season. I pray you are fully engaging in and leaning into your Lents – if you ever need help with prayer – inside or outside of Lent – please let me know! I am always here to help.
